18	It is hereby stipulated by and between the United States of America and claimant Thomas Previglian ("claimant" or "Previglian"), by and through their respective counsel, as follows: 1. On or about April 6, 2016, claimant Previglian filed a claim in the administrative forfeiture proceedings with the United States Postal Inspection Service with respect to the	
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21	Approximately \$6,300.00 in U.S. Currency. (hereafter "defendant currency"), which was seized on	
22	February 11, 2016.	
23	2. The United States Postal Inspection Service has sent the written notice of intent to forfeit required by 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(1)(A) to all known interested parties. The time has expired for any

25	person to file a claim to the defendant currency under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(2)(A)-(E), and no person	
26	other than the claimant has filed a claim to the defendant currency as required by law in the	
27	administrative forfeiture proceeding.	
28	administrative forfeiture proceeding.	1
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Under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the United States is required to file a complaint for
 forfeiture against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant
 currency is subject to forfeiture within ninety days after a claim has been filed in the administrative
 forfeiture proceedings, unless the court extends the deadline for good cause shown or by agreement of
 the parties. That deadline is July 5, 2016.

6 4. By Stipulation and Order filed July 8, 2016, the parties stipulated to extend to August 5,
7 2016, the time in which the United States is required to file a civil complaint for forfeiture against the
8 defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is subject to
9 forfeiture.

10 5. As provided in 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the parties wish by agreement to extend to
11 September 6, 2016, the time in which the United States is required to file a civil complaint for forfeiture
12 against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is
13 subject to forfeiture.

6. Accordingly, the parties agree that the deadline by which the United States shall be
required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment
alleging that the defendant currency is subject to forfeiture shall be extended to September 6, 2016.
