It appears that plaintiff has failed to comply with Local Rule 183(b), which 19 requires that a party appearing in propria persona inform the court of any address change. More 20 than sixty-three days have passed since the court order was returned by the postal service and 21 plaintiff has failed to notify the court of a current address. 22 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court randomly assign a 23 United States District Judge to this action. 24 IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice for 25 failure to prosecute. See Local Rule 183(b). 26 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 27 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within fourteen days 28 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 1

with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
