21	satisfied. (ECF No. 5-1 at 3.) Plaintiff argues that Defendant's use of his current hourly rate was	
22	improper because he is only seeking statutory minimum wages for the unpaid time. (ECF No. 5-1	
23	at 5.) As a result, Plaintiff contends Defendant failed to demonstrate the amount in controversy	
24	was satisfied. (ECF No. 5-1 at 5.) Defendant concedes that based on Plaintiff's argument, the	
25	statutory minimum has not been met. (ECF No. 7.)
