18	The petition in this case was filed on December 8, 2017. ECF No. 1. On February 23,	
19	2018, respondent filed a motion to dismiss the petitioner on the ground that it contained	
20	unexhausted claims and therefore that he was not eligible to proceed pursuant to 28 U.S.C.	
21	section 2254(b), which requires that all matters brought to the federal district court must be	
22	shown to have been first presented to the state's highest court. See O'Sullian v. Boerckel,	
23	526 U.S. 838, 844, 845 (1999). ECF No. 17. Petitioner tacitly agreed with respondent's position	
24	by filing a motion for a 30 day extension of time to permit him to file a motion for stay and	
25	abeyance. ECF. No. 19.	
26	In light of the foregoing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:	
27	1. Petitioner's request for an exte	ension of time is GRANTED;
