



1 and other advances” in this case. ECF No. 5. Both requests were denied by order filed May 11,  
2 2018. See ECF No. 7.

3 The undersigned issued findings and recommendations on May 11, 2018, recommending  
4 the dismissal of this action due to plaintiff’s failure to comply with the court’s December 28,  
5 2017 order directing the submission of a motion to proceed in forma pauperis or payment of the  
6 filing fee. ECF No. 7. On May 31, 2018, in response to plaintiff’s objections, ECF No. 8, the  
7 court vacated the findings and recommendations and extended the compliance deadline for an  
8 additional sixty days, see ECF No. 9.

9 The new deadline – July 30, 2018 – has expired without plaintiff’s compliance. Plaintiff’s  
10 failure to abide by an order of this court authorizes the dismissal of this action under both the  
11 Local Rules and Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Local Rule 110 provides that failure to  
12 comply with court orders or rules “may be grounds for imposition of any and all sanctions  
13 authorized by statute or Rule or within the inherent power of the Court.” Similarly, the Federal  
14 Rules of Civil Procedure authorize dismissal of an action for failure to prosecute or to comply  
15 with the rules or orders of the court. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).

16 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed for failure  
17 to abide by an order of this court. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).

18 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge  
19 assigned to this case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within fourteen (14)  
20 days after the filing date of these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written  
21 objections with the court. Such a document should be captioned “Objections to Magistrate  
22 Judge’s Findings and Recommendations.” Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within  
23 the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court’s order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951  
24 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
