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STIPULATION AND ORDER EXTENDING TIME
 FOR FILING A COMPLAINT FOR FORFEITURE
 AND/OR TO OBTAIN AN INDICTMENT
 ALLEGING FORFEITURE

It is hereby stipulated by and between the United States of America and potential claimant Stanley Jackson (“claimant”), by and through their respective counsel, as follows:

1. On or about July 24, 2017, claimant filed a claim in the administrative forfeiture proceeding with the U.S. Postal Inspection Service with respect to the Approximately \$5,020.00 in U.S. Currency (hereafter “defendant currency”), which was seized on May 18, 2017.
2. The U.S. Postal Inspection Service has sent the written notice of intent to forfeit required by 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(1)(A) to all known interested parties. The time has expired for any person to file a claim to the defendant currency under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(2)(A)-(E), and no person other than claimant has filed a claim to the defendant currency as required by law in the administrative forfeiture proceeding.
3. Under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the United States is required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is subject to forfeiture within ninety days after a claim has been filed in the administrative

1 forfeiture proceeding, unless the court extends the deadline for good cause shown or by agreement of the
2 parties. That deadline was October 20, 2017.

3 4. By Stipulation and Order filed October 20, 2017, the parties stipulated to extend to
4 November 20, 2017, the time in which the United States is required to file a civil complaint for forfeiture
5 against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is
6 subject to forfeiture.

7 5. By Stipulation and Order filed November 22, 2017, the parties stipulated to extend to
8 December 20, 2017, the time in which the United States is required to file a civil complaint for forfeiture
9 against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is
10 subject to forfeiture.

11 6. As provided in 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the parties wish by agreement to further extend
12 to January 19, 2018, the time in which the United States is required to file a civil complaint for forfeiture
13 against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the defendant currency is
14 subject to forfeiture.

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1 7. Accordingly, the parties agree that the deadline by which the United States shall be
2 required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the defendant currency and/or to obtain an indictment
3 alleging that the defendant currency is subject to forfeiture shall be extended to January 19, 2018.


