DECLARATION OF DONNY YOUNGBLOOD

to comply with California or federal law. Further, it creates public safety concerns because it restricts the KCSO's ability to share information with Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") and requires the KCSO to release aliens arrested for crimes from KCSO custody into the community without notifying ICE, without being able to notify federal authorities, or to facilitate transfer of these potentially dangerous individuals to federal authorities in a secure setting.

- 5. As Sheriff, I am also charged with balancing the needs of state law enforcement with public safety concerns. KCSO does not inquire into the immigration status of individuals who report crimes, witnesses, victims, or even suspects. KCSO relies on U Nonimmigrant Status (U-Visas) to protect witnesses or victims of crime, even if those individuals are unlawfully present in the United States. According to data reviewed by my staff, in 2016, KCSO received 103 requests for certifications, and 91 were certified; in 2017, KCSO received 114 requests for certifications, and 99 were certified; and thus far in 2018, KCSO received 46 requests for certifications, and 36 were certified. Thus, in my experience, our policy of cooperation with ICE detainers prior to SB 54 did not prevent the reporting of crimes by witnesses or victims.
- 6. One significant impact I have seen in our community is the fear SB54 created within our immigrant population. For many of our immigrants fear of the police in their own countries is real, and has contributed to their hesitancy to interact with law enforcement in our communities. Now, they believe we work in concert with ICE in our communities, and not just in our jails. Exacerbating this fear is the increase in ICE agents throughout our communities who are actively looking for the criminals we used to hand over in our jail, which is a controlled environment. We also know that many of these illegal immigrants who are released into our community re-offend and create more victims, many of whom are other illegal immigrants. SB 54 also hampers and sometimes eliminates us from even communicating with our federal partners, which of course makes us less efficient and less effective. The notion that SB54 increases our safety is not true. It absolutely makes our communities and our nation less safe.
