The matter was referred to a United States Magistrate Judge pursuant to 19 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302. 20 On September 11, 2018, the magistrate judge filed findings and recommendations herein 21 which were served on plaintiff and which contained notice to plaintiff that any objections to the 22 findings and recommendations were to be filed within fourteen days. Plaintiff filed objections to the findings and recommendations. However, plaintiff did not sign his objections. 23 24 Parties proceeding without counsel are required to sign all pleadings, motions, and other papers submitted to the court for filing. Fed. R. Civ. P. 11(a). Thus, the court is unable to 25 26 consider plaintiff's objections unless he signs them. 27 Plaintiff is granted an opportunity to re-file his objections, including a signature page 28 bearing his signature. Plaintiff is cautioned that this is not an opportunity for him to file new or

amended objections, but rather to provide a signature on the objections submitted on October 1, 2018. Further, plaintiff is warned that failure to submit signed objections could result in the district court considering the findings and recommendations without reviewing plaintiff's objections, or dismissal of this action based on plaintiff's failure to comply with this court's order. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b). Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that: 1. The Clerk of the Court shall send plaintiff a copy of plaintiff's October 1, 2018 objections, without the banner across the top (ECF No. 10); and 2.
