ORDER

Plaintiff is a former county inmate currently in state prison proceeding pro se and in forma pauperis in this federal civil rights action filed pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. On November 4, 2020, plaintiff filed a request for change of venue which the court construes as a motion for disqualification of the undersigned.<sup>1</sup> ECF No. 20. Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 455, a magistrate judge shall disqualify herself in any proceeding in which her impartiality might reasonably be questioned or where she has a personal bias or prejudice concerning a party. In plaintiff’s motion for disqualification, he speculates that the undersigned is biased against plaintiff based upon the rulings in his case. The court does not find disqualification is appropriate in this matter.
