

1 On remand, the Commissioner will develop the record as necessary; reconsider all
2 relevant issues; offer the claimant the opportunity to submit additional evidence; and issue a
3 new decision. The parties further request that the Court direct the Clerk of the Court to enter a
4 final judgment in favor of Plaintiff, and against Defendant, reversing the final decision of the
5 Commissioner.

6 This stipulation constitutes a remand under the fourth sentence of Section 205(g) of the
7 Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 405(g).
