Although it appears from the file that plaintiff's copy of the order was returned, plaintiff 22 23 was properly served. It is the plaintiff's responsibility to keep the court apprised of his current 24 address at all times. Pursuant to Local Rule 182(f), service of documents at the record address of 25 the party is fully effective. 26 In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is 27 directed to assign a district judge to this case; and 28 //// 1

IT IS RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. <u>See</u> Local Rule 110; Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).

These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations."
