ORDER DISMISSING CASE

Petitioner, a California prisoner, filed a pro se petition for a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254. He has paid the filing fee. He notes that he has another petition pending in this court challenging the same conviction. In Case No. 16-cv-5069 NJV, the petition was stayed so petitioner could exhaust further claims. Exhaustion has not been completed. In this case, petitioner states that he has new claims he seeks to add. All claims must be brought in the earlier filed petition. Therefore, this case is dismissed. When petitioner exhausts all of his claims in the earlier filed petition he may request to amend the petition and add these new claims and the court will consider his arguments at that time. The new claims must also be exhausted.

This case is **DISMISSED**. The clerk shall close this file. Because reasonable jurists would not find the result here debatable, a certificate of appealability ("COA") is **DENIED**. See Slack v. McDaniel, 529 U.S. 473, 484-85 (2000) (standard for COA).
