ORDER DENYING CERTIFICATE OF APPEALABILITY

On April 24, 2006, petitioner, a California prisoner proceeding pro se, filed the above-titled petition for a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254. On October 7, 2009, the Court denied the petition on the merits.

Petitioner has now filed a notice of appeal, which this Court deems a request for a certificate of appealability. See United States v. Asrar, 116 F.3d 1268, 1270 (9th Cir. 1991). Slack v. McDaniel, 529 U.S. 473, 484 (2000).
