

**ORDER THAT CASE BE REASSIGNED TO A
DISTRICT JUDGE**

On September 19, 2006, Plaintiff filed a Complaint and a Motion for Temporary Restraining Order. This case is currently assigned to a Magistrate Judge. Thus, the court issued an order setting September 20, 2006 as a deadline for all parties to file either a "Consent to Proceed Before a United States Magistrate Judge," or else a "Declination to Proceed Before a United States Magistrate Judge and Request for Reassignment."¹ As of September 21, 2006, none of the Defendants have filed a Consent to Proceed Before a United States Magistrate Judge. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this case be reassigned to a District Judge for further proceedings.
