17 The Court has received a letter from Claimant Claude Zamor --
18 sent to various judges but not, at first, to the undersigned, and
19 never filed on this case's docket -- indicating that he has "been
20 abused" in this case's settlement.

21 Mr Zamor received \$2,000 to compensate his claimed losses for
22 Quixtar-related business support materials, per this case's
23 settlement agreement. Afterward, he also requested a hardship
24 award, which the Special Master denied because Mr. Zamor, a
25 resident of Haiti, presented no proof that he operated a Quixtar
26 business in the United States (a requirement to participate in this
27 settlement) or that he had proved losses sufficient to qualify for
28 a hardship payment. Mr. Zamor then appealed that objection to the

1 Court, which the Court reviewed de novo and denied for the same
2 reasons as the Special Master.

3 Now Mr. Zamor asks for a "penalty or compensation," apparently
4 because he did not know that the settlement class was for
5 plaintiffs who operated Quixtar businesses in the United States,
6 even though he submitted a claim and received a payment under the
7 settlement. The Court finds no basis for such a "penalty or
8 compensation" in this case's settlement agreement, or, more
9 generally, in the law or facts relevant to this case. Mr. Zamor's
10 request is DENIED. Nor does the Court find that the Special Master
11 or any of the lawyers in this case have "abused" Mr. Zamor. To the
12 extent that Mr. Zamor's letter requests reconsideration of any of
13 his previous requests for class compensation, the request is
14 DENIED.
