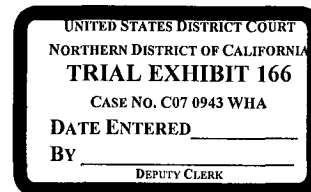
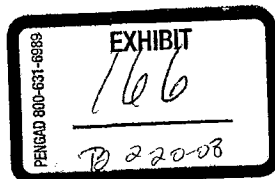
Parrish v. National Football League Players Association, et al.

Guys: We will have a new website up and running tomorrow if things continue to go right. We all helped create a media blitz of 46 articles in publications across the country. They were favorable to retired players unfavorable to Upshaw, Troy Vincent, Richard Berthelson, and Upshaw's agent Tom Condon they are the remaining abusive insiders left after the sudden mass exodus of long time NFLPA insiders Doug and Pat Allen, Howard Skall, Clay Walker suddenly found reasons to leave their high paying cushy NFLPA and Players Inc jobs and then in house bookkeeper William Garner also left, and Dave Meggysey left his cushy high paying job as well, then long time insider Brig Owen resigned after the new more detailed LM2 labor reports were required. In fact it is 770 pages of information and makes for some interesting reading.

HBO Bryant Gumbel aired a fine (accurate) program showing our retired player issues helping to ignite the media blitz and then we filed a class action suit against Players Inc. The next day after our filing the suit the NBA owners settled up with the NBA retired Players after stringing them out for years, they agreed to what looks like a good pension with a \$20,000 make up bonus included. Your we come NBA guys.

But we are just beginning our real push we intend to get justice for the retired players all of them all 3,500. If the retirement plan had been paying the retired players what they should have and Players Inc was paying all 3,500 players there would be no need for charitable events or services no need for phony magnanimous gestures by Upshaw or the league. We tore the pension out of the monopoly's hide in 1962 with the threat of an anti-trust suit. It cost some of us part of our NFL careers but we created the pension and gifted it to all future generations of players even those of today. We have seen Upshaw and Tagliabue use the Groom Law Group to divert the major portion of pension contributions into new fee generating pension, investment, and insurance schemes used to play waves of current players off against the retired players. Groom Law Group has created a cash cow for itself rewriting the CBA and the Retirement Plan documents in 1993 and 1994 then milking it for over \$15 million in legal fees in litigation against the retired players whose pension plan was paying Groom those fees. An insane arrangement. It has been a cruel joke the way Upshaw, Tagliabue, Groom Law Group, and Tom Condon, Upshaw's agent, who have used a willing NFLPA President Troy Vincent to fleece the active and retired players for Upshaw's absurd salary and unheard of benefits; all this manipulated and accommodated by NFLPA General Counsel Richard Berthelson who practices in DC but has no license to practice law there. Upshaw and Tagliabue show a callous disregard for the lives and health of not only the NFL players but the College, high school, and youth program players across the country that followed the misguided concussion policies and believed the 13 NFL sanctioned studies by Dr Elliot Pellman who they are hiding from the press today. Dr Pellman misrepresented his resume graduating from a Mexican Medical School in Guadalajara Mexico in a field that has nothing to do with brain injuries, instead of SUNY Stony Brook in NY. They are all part of a series of cabals that have cheated retired and active players causing brain injuries with horrendous consequences including debilitating depression and suicides.

They all must go. And we want the money back even the money they have taken in salary, we want it all back with punitive damages. The mental anguish caused by unnecessary financial hardships suffered by at least 1,000 retired players and their families by Upshaw et al is unforgivable. The summary of LM2's show some strange patterns of membership size and



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income jumping from \$167 million in 2005 to \$270 million in 2006 and they spent \$268 million of the \$270 million whereas in 2005 they only spent \$152 million. Why? What's up with the severe bookkeeping changes? They seem to try to make it appear that the size of the membership might cause the differences in income and expenses by including the 3700 retired players to raise the "membership" to 6,126 added to the 2080 members shown for the previous 3 years. This shows the NFLPA suddenly began claiming to represent the 3700 retired players in 2006. Why? This pumping up the membership by using the retired players had nothing to do with the strange income and expense numbers shown in this summary. Were the 2005 numbers understated or were the 2006 numbers overstated? Nothing changed that would cause such a large change in income and expenses from 2005 to 2006. This is another NFLPA Upshaw, Berthelson, Vincent, Condon, Groom Law, Tagliabue mystery to be unraveled by the courts. It is also strange that Players Inc income was \$106 million with \$46 million paid out leaving a clear \$60 million in cash. Yet the figures show that all but \$2 million of the \$270 million income was spent in 2006. What happened to the clear \$60 million from Players Inc? Further review of the LM2s show Upshaw is also paying himself "retention" bonuses totaling \$2,100,000 out of Players Inc to his Grantors Trust account. With Vincent and Condon's help he is paying himself \$4,517,767 in 2006. I wonder what kind of Trust fund they have the missing 21% ownership of Players Inc hidden in.

We are coming for justice and we are going to get it. Our webpage will be up and running if not tomorrow the next day. I want all of you retired players to go to that site and join us day after tomorrow. Required dues are \$0.00 none. You can help with \$25 if you wish totally voluntary. You'll be able to sign up on-line or print out a form fill it out and mail it in. If you know guys who don't do computer email, etc give them a print out of a form and have them mail it to us.

If you are aware of any video games, trading cards or whatever, that either names you or a team you played on like the 1965 Browns, and gives your height, weight, and number of years in the league or otherwise describes you, or you are named on the new monopoly game as Vince Costello and Bill Glass are named, let me know by email ASAP and we will track it down to be used as further evidence in our lawsuit.

Of Course what we win in court or negotiate licenses for will be paid out 100% (minus the phone light bill and mailings etc) to the 3500 retired players, not to any "deserving" few chosen by a dictator playing one group of players off against another while paying off those with a PR presence who could damaged Upshaw if they chose to speak the truth to the public as Mike Ditka, Harry Carson and others have been doing in recent weeks. We have a long way to go but we are right and we seek nothing but the truth and justice and we will win for all 3,500 retired players and their families.

CONFIDENTIAL: Bruce: I have no intent whatever to profit from this law suit or our representation of the retired 3,500 retired players. I estimate that from 700 to 1000 of them are suffering real financial hardships that they would not be suffering if they were treated fairly by Players Inc or rather their licensing representative, the retirement plan, and the disability system. I could never profit a penny from their financial misery. I'll take my 1/3,500 and my share of fair retirement benefits like my brothers. I will have put in one year March 1st 7 days a week. I haven't played golf gone fishing or taken a day off. I don't even want a thank you. I should have done this 10 or 20 years ago.

I have kept you fully informed about what I was doing and planning. You probably didn't believe I could do it. Why would you nobody else has been able to. I do want you to join us but I don't really know Butch Byrd, or the other fellows you mentioned. I sure want you on our Board, but I don't intend to lose control of this lawsuit or this non-profit 100% representation of the players and risk having anyone profiting from their miserable situations. That is not going to happen.

Goodell telephoned one of my good friends, yeah the NFL "Pope" Goodell, and I was the subject of conversation. If you would like to talk to that retired player friend that Goodell called, to hear what he told Goodell I'll call him and ask if he would mind telling you what was said. I also learned yesterday that Upshaw started telling people on Feb 15th that now he is planning to retire next year 2008 at this time. He isn't going to have the option to retire and I guarantee you Troy Vincent will not succeed him. The NFLPA will probably be in trusteeship run by the government like the Teamsters were for awhile.

I explained to you quite awhile back the way to organize was around a class action suit so everyone will have a dog in the fight. There are plenty of guys who are still afraid of the NFLPA, Upshaw and the mighty league. They may hold back for a little bit but they'll join us when we keep moving ahead. Our website will be up and running this week-end, it may be already up. Dues are voluntary from \$) to a voluntary \$100 or whatever they'd like. We want to make it so everyone can join while the guys who need it most can just sign up.

We are not going to the NFLPA or the NFL begging, we are not even asking, we are going to tear it out of the hides of those who have been abusing 3,500 retired players: just like we tore the Pension Plan, which they are destroying with the Upshaw/Tagliabue collusion, out of the hides of the owners in 1962.

Gumbel was right Upshaw has been on their leash. There will also be congressional hearings; one of the key staffers involved sent me a congratulatory email when he saw the NY Times articles on the 15th and 16th. I do work alone a lot that cuts down the number of people who can stab me in the back an NFLPA/NFL trait. Next there will be a class action against the retirement plan seeking punitive damages as well as the 100's of millions they owe us. Then there will be an anti-trust suit that includes them all. We will also sue the vendors Players Inc is doing business with.

They know I'll never make a deal with them and any offer they attempt will be on the front page of the NY Times too. I intend to give Upshaw and his cronies what they deserve for the pain and suffering they have inflicted on our brothers and their families. I have gotten calls warning me Upshaw has made remarks about "getting me" meaning they think he means he may put a contract out on me. I spent a few bloody years with the Teamsters Union; Upshaw is in over his head. I spoke to Clem Daniel about Upshaw's relationship to Mafia front Allen Glick and the dearly departed Allen Dorfman the Teamsters Central States Pension Fund gate keeper. I thought Clem was having a nervous breakdown, he didn't want to talk about it. Al Davis introduced Upshaw to Glick and Dorfman when he cut Upshaw into a shopping center deal in Oakland. Upshaw admits he had an office in the shopping center and did some work for them and had a restaurant and bar a few blocks away but said "I knew Glick, but I never invested any money with him. There were no documents signed. My business was not located in the mall..." Really no documents signed, really! sounds like vintage Upshaw to me. Ron Mix was also involved with Glick.

Bruce, I am going to finish this fight no matter how dirty it gets or what it takes or where it goes I am not in it to make any deal. Upshaw is a rotten bastard and he is going down so is Condon and Vincent and Berthelson and those who took off and Goodell knows it and he will probably go to. This may not be a fight you want in. Think about it I do expect it to get real dirty down to my kind of fight. He should never have screwed all our brothers' families over.
