2 MR. LEVIN: So the facts that I'm aware
3 of related to his health issues are, Mr. Raven, I
4 believe --

5 THE COURT: And this would be the portion that
6 would be sealed now. Okay. Go ahead.

7 MR. LEVIN: -- in the December time frame had
8 kidney failure --

9 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

10 MR. LEVIN: -- was in the hospital for several
11 weeks.

12 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

13 MR. LEVIN: He has had a number of surgeries
14 trying to stabilize him. I think he's relatively stable
15 now. He is awaiting a possible kidney transplant.

16 THE COURT: Mm-hmm.

17 MR. LEVIN: In the meantime, he's on dialysis
18 four days a week, I believe about four hours per day.

19 THE COURT: Mm-hmm. And otherwise at home or
20 at work, or what?

21 MR. LEVIN: Yeah. He -- I believe he's having
22 his healthcare in Pleasanton. He's a resident of
23 Nevada. Because of the surgery -- I think the company
24 has offices both in Pleasanton and Nevada, so lately
25 he's been in the Pleasanton area. I don't know if he's

1 working from home or working or going back and forth.

2 He's not on his death bed. I don't want to
3 exaggerate his level of health issues. He's operating
4 as the CEO of Rimini Street and is active in his
5 business, but does have these issues of, potentially,
6 unexpected surgeries, planned surgeries, the need for
7 four days a week of --

8 THE COURT: Okay. Well, planned surgeries we
9 would work around in advance. Days of the week would
10 have to be worked around. Unplanned -- if a kidney
11 transplant suddenly becomes available, that would be
12 good cause, if it was available immediately, which I
13 guess is how those things happen, I suppose -- that
14 would be a reason, obviously, to postpone the
15 deposition. But yeah, there's a queue, I suppose, so he
16 may not be able to jump to the head of the line anyway.
17 So, but were that to happen for some unexpected reason,
18 then that would be a good cause for postponing the
19 deposition, certainly. But none of those things
20 convince me that it should be confined to seven hours.

21 But I need to hear more from the parties as to
22 what they need to do and just how adverse or not adverse
23 is he to the defendant. I mean, he's an adverse witness
24 of the plaintiff, presumably.

25 MR. LEVIN: In terms of his adversity, I don't
