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1	Plaintiffs, Natural Resources Defense Council, Inc., International Fund for Animal		
2	Welfare, the Humane Society of the United States, Cetacean Society International, League for		
3	Coastal Protection, Ocean Futures Society, and Jean-Michel Cousteau, and Defendants, Carlos M.		
4	Gutierrez, Secretary of the United States Department of Commerce, the National Marine Fisheries		
5	Service, James Balsiger, Acting Assistant Administrator for Fisheries of the National Oceanic and		
6	Atmospheric Administration, William Brennan, Acting Administrator of the National Oceanic and		
7	Atmospheric Administration, the United States Department of the Navy, Donald C. Winter,		
8	Secretary of the Navy; and Admiral Gary Roughead, Chief of Naval Operations (the "Parties"),		
9	hereby stipulate and agree as follows:		
10	RECITALS		
11	WHEREAS, on September 17, 2007, Plaintiffs filed this action alleging violations of the		
12	Endangered Species Act ("ESA"), 16 U.S.C. §§ 1531-1544, the National Environmental Policy		
13	Act ("NEPA"), 42 U.S.C. §§ 4321-4370f, and the Marine Mammal Protection Act ("MMPA"),		
14	16 U.S.C. 1371-1421h, and requesting injunctive relief to enjoin Defendants' use of SURTASS low-		
15	frequency active ("LFA") sonar;		
16	WHEREAS, on February 6, 2008, the District Court for the Northern District of California		
17	granted in part and denied in part Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Injunction and ordered the		
18	Parties to meet and confer regarding the terms of a tailored preliminary injunction that would		
19	restrict, but not prohibit, the use of LFA sonar pending final resolution of this action;		
20	WHEREAS, on August 8, 2008, after participating in two settlement conferences, the Parties		
21	filed a Stipulated Settlement Agreement ("August 2008 Stipulation") which resolved the entire		
22	action and provided for the dismissal with prejudice of the above-captioned lawsuit;		
23	WHEREAS, the Court entered an Order approving the Stipulation on August 12, 2008		
24	("August 2008 Order");		
25	WHEREAS, the August 2008 Stipulation and Order provided that Defendants would pay		
26	Plaintiffs a reasonable amount for their costs of litigation, including reasonable attorneys' fees, while		
27	preserving the right to contest specific fees or expenses, including hourly rates, and further provided		

- that the Parties would employ good faith efforts to reach an expeditious negotiated resolution of the
- 2 amount of such costs and fees;
- WHEREAS, the August 2008 Stipulation and Order provided that the Court would retain
- 4 jurisdiction of the case for purposes of resolving attorneys' fees and cost reimbursement issues under
- 5 the Equal Access to Justice Act ("EAJA") in the event the Parties are not able to reach a negotiated
- 6 resolution thereof;
- WHEREAS, on September 26, 2008, Plaintiffs applied for attorneys' fees, costs, and
- 8 expenses under EAJA by filing their Motion for Fees and Costs Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2412
- 9 (hereinafter "Motion");
- WHEREAS, the Parties have negotiated a settlement of Plaintiffs' claim for attorneys' fees,
- 11 costs and expenses;
- WHEREAS, the Parties enter this Stipulation Regarding Settlement of Attorneys' Fees,
- Costs, and Expenses ("Stipulation") without any admission of fact or law, or waiver of any claims or
- defenses, factual or legal.

THEREFORE THE PARTIES HEREBY STIPULATE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Defendants agree to pay and Plaintiffs agree to accept \$750,000.00 in full settlement
- of all Plaintiffs' claims under any authority for attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred in the
- above-captioned litigation.
- Defendants will make payment of the \$750,000.00 in two installments of
- 20 \$375,000.00.

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- 3. Both installments of \$375,000.00 shall be paid no later than 30 days after the Court's
- entry of the Stipulation and Order. However, Defendants will make best efforts to complete the
- payment of both installments before December 31, 2008.
- 4. All payments will be made by electronic funds transfer to Morrison & Foerster LLP,
- 25 425 Market Street, San Francisco, California 94105.
- 26 5. Plaintiffs agree to provide within one day after the effective date of this Stipulation
- the following information necessary for Defendants to process the disbursements: the Plaintiffs'
- names, the payees' names, the payees' address, the payees' bank account number, the account type,

- 1 the bank routing transit number ("RTN"), the payees' tax identification number, and a complete and
- 2 accurate NOAA Vendor Profile Form for electronic funds transfers. Any delay in providing any part
- 3 of this information shall extend the deadlines in paragraph 3 by the length of the delay.
- 4 6. By this Stipulation, Defendants do not waive any right to contest any aspect of
- 5 attorneys' fees, costs, or expenses, including hourly rates, claimed by Plaintiffs or Plaintiffs' counsel
- 6 in future litigation. This Stipulation has no precedential value and shall not be used as evidence in
- 7 any other attorneys' fees litigation.
- No provision of this Stipulation shall be interpreted as or constitute a commitment or
- 9 requirement that Defendants obligate or pay funds in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C.
- 10 § 1341, or any other law or regulation.
- 8. Because this Stipulation resolves all of Plaintiffs' claims to fees, costs, and expenses
- in the above-captioned matter ("Fee Claims") under any authority, Plaintiffs hereby withdraw their
- Motion and release Defendants from the Fee Claims.
- 14 9. This Stipulation contains the entire agreement between the parties to this Stipulation,
- and all previous understandings, agreements, and communications prior to the date hereof, whether
- express or implied, oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Stipulation, are fully and
- completely extinguished and superseded by this Stipulation. This Stipulation may be modified upon
- mutual written consent of the parties and the Court's approval of a joint stipulation to modify this
- 19 Stipulation.
- 20 The undersigned representatives of the Plaintiffs and Defendants certify that they are
- fully authorized by the party or parties whom they represent to enter into the terms and conditions of
- this Stipulation and to legally bind them to it.
- 23 11. The provisions of this Stipulation shall apply to and be binding upon each of the
- parties including, but not limited to, their officers, directors, servants, employees, successors, and
- 25 assigns.
- The parties further ask that the Court vacate the hearing on Plaintiffs' Motion, which
- is currently set for January 20, 2009, at 2:00 PM.
