The Court reserved March 23 and 24, 2015, for a two-day evidentiary hearing on the matter and ordered Mr. Olins present.

Due to on-going discovery and other yet-to-be-finalized matters, the Court also directed the parties to submit a joint prehearing statement, on or before March 9, 2015, to address any continuing concerns.

As of today's date, Plaintiff has taken several depositions, including Mr. Olins' deposition in New York, and served subpoenas for documents on a number of parties. Plaintiff has identified additional parties that it intends on serving with subpoenas for depositions and additional documents. Plaintiff also indicates that it is currently corresponding with the Attorney General's Office for the Isle of Man in an attempt to obtain possibly relevant business records.

Due to on going discovery which Plaintiff is entitled, to allow the parties to review and analyze said discovery, and to allow the parties to continue to meet and confer regarding discovery and any resultant issues, the parties seek to continue the hearing, currently set for March 23 and 24, 2015, until July 6 and 7, 2015. The date appears to be available based on communications with the Court's Clerk. The parties will provide the Court with a joint status brief on June 22, 2015.
