ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

 11 When Plaintiffs' counsel failed to appear at a 10 a.m. hearing on September 20, 2010,
 12 the Court invited Defendants' counsel to submit declarations setting forth the time they lost
 13 as a result, as well as their regular hourly rate.¹ Instead, Defendants' counsel submitted the
 14 regular hourly rate of their opponents. This is not the information the Court requested.

15 It has become apparent that the parties in this case are incapable of following the
 16 Court's directions when an alternative course would disadvantage their opponents. Both
 17 parties should expect further sanctions if this conduct continues.

18 As to sanctions relating to the hearing on September 20, 2010, Plaintiffs' counsel are
 19 hereby ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE in writing by October 1, 2010, as to why the Court
 20 should not order them to pay, jointly and severally, \$300 to each of Defendants' attorneys
 21 who appeared at the hearing.
