16	concerning the law regulating the taking of depositions in
17	Germany, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the depositions of Dr.
18	Menken, and the Rule 30(b)(6) deposition of Sanofi-Aventis
19	Germany, occur on April 1, 2009, and April 2, 2009,
20	respectively, in Frankfurt, at either the homes or places of
21	business of the respective witnesses, where they have
22	consented to be deposed.
23	The parties' uncertainties on how to proceed with the
24	German depositions stem partly from the inconsistent guidance
25	given by the State Department and the United States Diplomatic
26	Mission to Germany on their respective web sites. U.S.

However, I have read the diplomatic notes exchanged 8 9 between Germany and the U.S. on this issue. See Exchange of 10 Notes Between the United States of America and the Federal Republic of Germany, dated October 8, 1956 and February 1, 11 12 1980, T.I.A.S. No. 9938, 32 U.S.T. 4189, 1980 WL 309267. 13 Those exchanges establish that a witness who consents to be 14 deposed at the witness's home or place of business need not be deposed at the Consulate.¹ Courts have recognized that the 15 Haque Convention is not necessarily the exclusive means of 16 obtaining discovery. See e.g., Laker Airways Ltd. v. Pan 17 American World Airways, 103 F.R.D. 42, 51 (D.D.C. 1984). 18

¹ Specifically, in one of the diplomatic exchanges, Germany agrees to "visits by American investigating offers to non-Americans for the purpose of questioning within the meaning of the [previous agreement] at the latter's homes and places of business, provided the persons to be questioned expressly request questioning to be conducted at their homes or places of business, or expressly consent to this form of questioning." The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Note Verbale, T.I.A.S. No. 9938, 32 U.S.T. 4181 (October 8, 1956).
