On May 16, 2014, plaintiffs moved the Court for an Order to permit the filing of their opposition to defendant's motion for partial summary judgment and supporting evidence under seal – if defendant Wal-Mart establishes the material is sealable. <i>Id</i> . Under Civil Local Rule 79-5(e), where "the Submitting Party is seeking to file under seal a document designated as confidential by the opposing party or a non-party pursuant to a protective order [,] [w]ithin 4 days of the filing of the Administrative Motion to File Under Seal, the Designating Party must file a declaration as required by subsection 79-5(d)(1)(A) establishing that all of the designated material is sealable." To date, Wal-Mart has not filed the required declaration. Accordingly, the Court DENIES plaintiff's motion to seal.
