Defendant seeks a stay of the order in order to reach an agreement with plaintiffs' counsel about
a "script" to be used when plaintiff's counsel contacts policyholders. Plaintiff's counsel have
represented that they will comply with the Court's instructions, and the Court finds that an agreed-upon
script is unnecessary. Defendant's request for a stay is DENIED.

Defendant also requests leave to file a motion for reconsideration based upon an unpublished decision in *In re Nat'l Western Life Ins. Deferred Annuities Litig.*, Case No. 05-CV-1018-JLS (LSP) (S.D. Cal. Jan. 11, 2010), Docket No. 85 Ex. F. In that case, the court denied without prejudice a motion to certify a class of a proposed class of annuity purchasers.² There is no discussion in the order about the propriety of class member identification discovery, and the order does not provide any basis for reconsideration of the Court's February 9, 2010 order. Instead, defendant's motion for leave to file a motion for reconsideration simply reargues the contentions that the Court previously rejected. Defendant's request for leave to file a motion for reconsideration is DENIED.

Defendant shall comply with the February 9, 2010 order no later than March 12, 2010.
