17 The district court has referred all discovery to United States Magistrate Judge Laurel Beeler.

18 Referral Order, ECF No. 88 at 1.¹ The district court noted that it was unclear whether there was a
19 pending discovery dispute. *Id.*

If the parties have a current dispute that requires the Court's assistance, the Court directs the parties to comply with the procedures for addressing discovery disputes set forth in Judge Beeler's standing order (attached). Those procedures require, among other things, that if a meet-and-confer by other means does not resolve the parties' dispute, lead counsel for the parties must meet and confer **in person**. If that procedure does not resolve the disagreement, the parties must file a joint letter instead of a formal motion. After reviewing the joint letter, the Court will evaluate whether further proceedings are necessary, including any further briefing or argument.


