1 parties will litigate a motion to suppress which will be heard by the state trial court. The issues to
2 be decided in that hearing may be relevant to the proceedings in this case.
3

4 3. If this case were to proceed, claimant's Fifth Amendment rights against self-
5 incrimination will be burdened in the related criminal case.
6

7 3. The provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 981(g)(2), related to stays of civil forfeiture proceedings,
8 provide that “[u]pon the motion of a claimant, the court shall stay the civil forfeiture proceeding
9 with respect to that claimant if the court determines that (A) the claimant is the subject of a
10 related criminal investigation or case; (B) the claimant has standing to assert a claim in the civil
11 forfeiture proceeding; and (C) continuation of the forfeiture proceeding will burden the right of
12 the claimant against self-incrimination in the related investigation or case.
13

14 4. Pursuant to the above representations, and the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 981(g)(2), the
15 parties hereby stipulate and agree to stay this civil forfeiture proceeding until the completion of
16 the criminal proceedings in Mendocino County state court or until such earlier time as either
17 party, or this Court, may request that the matter be heard.
18

19 5. The parties further stipulate and agree that they request this Court also take off
20 calendar the presently scheduled Case Management Conference of 28 August 2009, at 10:30 a.m.
