19 In the event a discovery dispute arises, the parties shall meet in person or, if counsel are outside the Bay Area, 20 21 by telephone and make a good faith effort to resolve their 22 dispute. Exchanging letters or telephone messages about the 23 dispute is insufficient. The Court will not read subsequent 2.4 positioning letters; parties shall instead make a 25 contemporaneous record of their meeting using a tape recorder 26 or a court reporter.

In the event they cannot resolve their dispute, theparties must participate in a telephone conference with the

Court before filing any discovery motions or other papers. The party seeking discovery shall request a conference in a letter **filed electronically** not exceeding two pages (with no attachments) which briefly explains the nature of the action and the issues in dispute. Other parties shall reply in similar fashion within two days of receiving the letter requesting the conference. The Court will contact the parties to schedule the conference.
