He also requests a certificate of appealability ("COA") pursuant to 28 U.S.C. 2253(c) and Rule 22(b) of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure. Reasonable jurists would not find it debatable that the court was correct in its procedural ruling and that petitioner stated a valid claim for the violation of his constitutional rights. *Slack v. McDaniel*, 529 U.S. 473, 484 (2000). The request for a certificate of appealability (docket number 13) is **DENIED**.
