1	DISCUSSION
2	A. <u>Standard of Review</u>
3	This court may entertain a petition for a writ of habeas corpus "in behalf of a
4	person in custody pursuant to the judgment of a State court only on the ground that
5	he is in custody in violation of the Constitution or laws or treaties of the United
6	States." 28 U.S.C. § 2254(a).
7	It shall "award the writ or issue an order directing the respondent to show
8	cause why the writ should not be granted, unless it appears from the application that
9	the applicant or person detained is not entitled thereto." Id. § 2243.
10	B. <u>Legal Claims</u>
11	Petitioner claims that the Bureau of Prisons ("BOP") arbitrarily denied her
12	immediate transfer to a Residential Reentry Center ("RRC") under the revised
13	Second Chance Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3621, pending her release on probation. Petitioner
14	claims that the BOP's denial is part of the discrimination she has experienced during
15	her incarceration due to her Vodun religion. Liberally construed, this claim is
16	cognizable.

18	CONCLUSION
19	For the foregoing reasons and for good cause shown,
20	1. The clerk shall serve by certified mail a copy of this order and the
21	petition and all attachments thereto on respondent and respondent's attorney, the
22	United States Attorney for the Northern District of California. The clerk also
23	shall serve a copy of this order on petitioner.
24	2. Respondent shall file with the court and serve on petitioner, within
25	thirty (30) days of the issuance of this order, an answer showing cause why a writ
26	of habeas corpus should not be granted on petitioner's cognizable claim.
27	Respondent shall file with the answer and serve on petitioner a copy of all records
28	that are relevant to a determination of the issues presented by the petition.

If petitioner wishes to respond to the answer, she shall do so by filing a traverse with the court and serving it on respondent within **fifteen (15) days** of her receipt of the answer.

Respondent may file a motion to dismiss on procedural grounds in lieu of an answer. If respondent files such a motion, petitioner shall file with the court and serve on respondent an opposition or statement of non-opposition within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the motion, and respondent shall file with the court and serve on petitioner a reply within fifteen (15) days of receipt of any opposition.

4. Petitioner is reminded that all communications with the court must be served on respondent by mailing a true copy of the document to respondent's counsel. Petitioner must also keep the court and all parties informed of any change of address.

5. It is petitioner's responsibility to prosecute this case. Petitioner must keep the Court and respondent informed of any change of address and must comply with the Court's orders in a timely fashion. Failure to do so may result in the dismissal of this action for failure to prosecute pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 41(b).
