**JNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT** For the Northern District of California 10 Pending before the Court is the Counter-Defendants' Motion to Dismiss. Upon review of the 11 record in this action, the Court notes that not all parties have not filed written consents to Magistrate 12 Judge James' jurisdiction. This civil case was randomly assigned to Magistrate Judge James for all 13 purposes including trial. In accordance with Title 28, U.S.C. § 636(c), the magistrate judges of this 14 district court are designated to conduct any and all proceedings in a civil case, including trial and 15 entry of final judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a judgment entered by 16 Magistrate Judge James may be taken directly to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth 17 Circuit in the same manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a district court.

18 You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and 19 disposition. Accordingly, the parties that have not already done so shall inform the Court whether 20 they consent to Magistrate Judge James' jurisdiction or request reassignment to a United States 21 District Judge for trial. A copy of both the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the 22 Northern District of California's website at http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/. From the homepage, 23 click on the "Forms" tab on the left margin, then choose "Civil." The parties shall inform the Court 24 of their decision by November 12, 2009.
