9	Pending before the Court is Shlomo D. Katz's pro hac vice application (Dkt. #6). Upon
10	review of the record in this action, the Court notes that Defendant has not filed a written consent to
11	Magistrate Judge James' jurisdiction. This civil case was randomly assigned to Magistrate Judge
12	James for all purposes including trial. In accordance with Title 28, U.S.C. § 636(c), the magistrate
13	judges of this district court are designated to conduct any and all proceedings in a civil case,
14	including trial and entry of final judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a
15	judgment entered by Magistrate Judge James may be taken directly to the United States Court of
10	

Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in the same manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a districtcourt.

You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and disposition. Accordingly, Defendant shall inform the Court whether it consents to Magistrate Judge James' jurisdiction or requests reassignment to a United States District Judge for trial. A copy of both the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the Northern District of California's website at http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/. From the homepage, click on the "Forms" tab on the left margin, then choose "Civil." The consent/declination form shall be filed by November 4, 2009.
