This habeas corpus action by pro se prisoner Faye Slice 19 was filed on February 26, 2010. Doc #1. The court notified 20 petitioner in writing at that time that the action was deficient 21 because she did not pay the requisite \$ 5.00 filing fee or, instead, 22 submit a signed and completed court-approved in forma pauperis 23 application, including a completed certificate of funds in her 24 prison account and a copy of her prison trust account statement for 25 the last six months. See 28 USC § 1915(a)(2). Petitioner was 26 advised that failure to file the requested items within thirty (30) 27 days would result in dismissal of the action. Doc #2. 28 11

1 Over forty (40) days have elapsed since petitioner was 2 notified of her filing deficiency; however, she has not provided the 3 court with the requisite items, or sought an extension of time to do The action, therefore, is DISMISSED without prejudice subject 4 so. 5 to filing a new habeas action accompanied by the requisite \$5.00 6 filing fee or a signed and completed in forma pauperis application. 7 Further, a certificate of appealability is DENIED. See Rule 11(a) 8 of the Rules Governing Section 2254 Cases (effective Dec 1, 2009). 9 Petitioner may not appeal the denial of a certificate of 10 appealability in this court but may seek a certificate from the 11 court of appeals under Rule 22 of the Federal Rules of Appellate 12 Procedure.
