14	judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a judgment entered by Magistrate Judge
15	James may be taken directly to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in the same
16	manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a district court.
17	You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and
18	disposition. Accordingly, Plaintiff shall inform the Court whether he consents to Magistrate Judge
19	James' jurisdiction or requests reassignment to a United States District Judge for trial. A copy of
20	both the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the Northern District of California's
21	website at http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/. From the homepage, click on the "Forms" tab on the left
22	margin, then choose "Civil." The consent/declination form shall be filed by April 22, 2010.
