1 ability to honor the assignment will depend on whether the fees and expenses are subject to any 2 offset allowed under the United States Department of the Treasury's Offset Program. After the 3 order for EAJA fees and expenses and costs is entered, the government will determine whether 4 they are subject to any offset. 5 Fees and expenses shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but if the Department of the 6 Treasury determines that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause 7 the payment of fees and expenses to be made directly to David J. Linden, pursuant to the 8 assignment executed by Plaintiff. Any payments made shall be delivered to Plaintiff's counsel. 9 This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA 10 attorney fees and expenses, and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of 11 Defendant under the EAJA.
