11 IN RE: ELECTRONIC FILING IN CASES WITH UNREPRESENTED PARTIES

13 When the Electronic Case Filing (ECF/e-filing) program was established for civil
14 cases in January 2003 (see generally General Order 45), the court's practice was to exclude from the
15 e-filing program cases in which any party was not represented by an attorney. Pursuant to Part III of
16 General Order 45, the court's ECF webpage provided: "All cases involving pro se parties are
17 excluded from the e-filing program and must be filed entirely in paper, unless otherwise ordered by
18 the court."

19 Effective immediately, cases with unrepresented party litigants in which at least one
20 party is represented by an attorney will no longer be excluded from the e-filing program. All
21 *represented* parties will e-file their submissions to the court on the same basis as in cases not
22 involving pro se litigants and in compliance with all parts of General Order 45. *Represented* parties
23 will be required to serve paper copies by mail on *unrepresented* parties only. As before,
24 unrepresented litigants will continue to file and serve all submissions to the court in paper form
25 unless prior leave is obtained from the assigned judge in a particular case.
