Jared H. Beck



Jared H. Beck was born in Albany, New York and grew up in upstate New York. His father is a lifelong union worker, and his mother is a public librarian. Jared grew up in a home that instilled in him the values of hard work, fair play and gratitude for life's blessings.

Jared was raised with an appreciation for the advantages of his upbringing, as his grandfather came of age during the Great Depression, the youngest in a family of 13 children with a blind mother and a father who died young. Jared took to heart the stories of hunger and desperation that afflicted not only the family but gripped the nation as a whole.
