(Docket # 18.) A 90-day extension is not 16 warranted under the circumstances mentioned in plaintiff's request. Most notably, plaintiff has 17 not shown specific discovery needs that warrant such a long extension and, as defendants 18 suggest, the fact that they raised a qualified immunity defense in their motion for summary 19 judgment means that they likely will be entitled to a stay of discovery if they request it. Upon 20 due consideration of plaintiff's request, the court GRANTS a 60-day extension of the deadline. 21 The court now sets the following new briefing schedule on the motion for summary judgment: 22 1. Plaintiff must file and serve on defense counsel his opposition to the motion for 23 summary judgment no later than October 7, 2011. 24 2. Defendants must file and serve their reply brief (if any) no later than October 24, 25 2011. 26
