15	final judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a judgment entered by Magistrate	
16	Judge James may be taken directly to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in the	
17	same manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a district court.	
18	You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and	
19	disposition. Accordingly, the parties shall inform the Court whether they consent to Magistrate	
20	Judge James' jurisdiction or request reassignment to a United States District Judge for trial. A copy	
21	of both the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the Northern District of California's	
22	website at http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/. From the homepage, click on the "Forms" tab on the left	
23	margin, then choose "Civil." The parties shall inform the Court of their decision by December 20,	
24	2010.
