Defendants' motion seeks to file the documents under seal pursuant to Local Rule 79-5(e) because the documents include information that Plaintiff has designated as confidential. Local Rule 79-5(e)(1) provides that "[w]ithin 4 days of the filing of the Administrative Motion to File Under Seal, the Designating Party must file a declaration as required by subsection 79-5(d)(1)(A) establishing that all of the designated material is sealable." N.D. Cal. Civ. L.R. 79-5(e)(1). Because Plaintiff has failed to file the supporting declaration as required by Rule 79-5(e)(1), the motion to file under seal is accordingly DENIED.
