9 Pending before the Court are Plaintiff's pro hac vice applications. Upon review of the record
 10 in this action, the Court notes that Plaintiff has not filed a written consent to magistrate judge
 11 jurisdiction jurisdiction. This civil case was randomly assigned to the undersigned magistrate judge
 12 for all purposes including trial. In accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 636(c), the magistrate judges of this
 13 district court are designated to conduct any and all proceedings in a civil case, including trial and
 14 entry of final judgment, upon the consent of the parties. An appeal from a judgment entered by a
 15 magistrate judge may be taken directly to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in
 16 the same manner as an appeal from any other judgment of a district court.

17 You have the right to have your case assigned to a United States District Judge for trial and
 18 disposition. Accordingly, Plaintiff shall inform the Court whether Plaintiff consents to magistrate
 19 judge jurisdiction or requests reassignment to a United States District Judge for trial. A copy of both
 20 the consent and declination forms may be obtained from the Northern District of California's website
 21 at <http://www.cand.uscourts.gov/>. From the homepage, choose "Forms" and then "Civil Forms."
 22 The consent/declination form shall be filed by September 12, 2011.
