Petitioner's request for a COA (docket # 12) is DENIED because 16 petitioner has not made "a substantial showing of the denial of a constitutional 17 18 right." 28 U.S.C. § 2253(c)(2). Petitioner has not demonstrated that "jurists of 19 reason would find it debatable whether the petition states a valid claim of the 20 denial of a constitutional right and that jurists of reason would find it debatable 21 whether the district court was correct in its procedural ruling." Slack v. 22 McDaniel, 529 U.S. 473, 484 (2000). 23 The clerk shall forward to the court of appeals the case file with this order. See United States v.
