submitted a signed and completed court-approved <u>in forma pauperis</u>
application (Doc. #2). <u>See</u> 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(2). Plaintiff was
advised that failure to file the requested items within thirty (30)
days would result in dismissal of the action. Doc. ## 2 & 3.

5 On April 4, 2012, the Court granted Plaintiff an extension 6 of time to May 5, 2012, to file his complaint and either file an <u>in</u> 7 <u>forma pauperis application</u> or pay the filing fee. The deadline has 8 passed and Plaintiff has not provided the Court with the requisite 9 items. The action, therefore, is DISMISSED without prejudice. No 10 filings fees are due.

11 The Clerk is directed to terminate all pending motions as 12 moot and close the file.
