11	Plaintiff, a Rhode Island citizen, filed this action in Santa Clara Superior Court asserting	
12	claims for breach of contract and common counts against a number of California citizens.	
13	Defendant Deborah Beth Kirsch removed the case, contending that federal jurisdiction exists on the	
14	basis of diversity of citizenship. Plaintiff now moves to remand pursuant to the "no local defendant	
15	rule" set forth in 28 U.S.C. § 1441(b). This rule precludes removal based on diversity jurisdiction	
16	where any defendant is a citizen of the state in which the action was brought. 28 U.S.C. § 1441(b);	
17	Spencer v. U.S. Dist. Ct. N.D. Cal. (Altec Indus., Inc.), 393 F.3d 867, 870 (9th Cir. 2004)	
18	("[Diversity actions] shall be removable only if none of the parties in interest properly joined and	
19	served as defendants is a citizen of the State in which such action is brought."). Here, Kirsch's	
	notice of removal acknowledges that she is a California citizen. <i>See</i> Dkt. No. 1 at 2 ("All Defendants are citizens of California."). Accordingly, plaintiff's motion to remand is granted.
