
ORDER GRANTING LEAVE TO PROCEED

Plaintiff Danny McCoy, an inmate at Lompoc Federal Prison located in Lompoc, California, has filed two pro se complaints under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 in which he applies to proceed in forma pauperis (IFP) under 28 U.S.C. § 1915. His applications to proceed IFP are granted. (Case No. 3874 TEH, Doc. #2; Case No. 3875 TEH, Doc. #3). The total filing fee due is \$ 350.00 for each case and the initial partial filing fee due at this time is \$ 0.00. See 28 U.S.C.

3 INSTRUCTIONS FOR PAYMENT OF PRISONER'S FILING FEE

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5 The prisoner shown as the Plaintiff or Petitioner on the attached
6 Order has filed a civil action in forma pauperis in this Court and
7 owes to the Court a filing fee. Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915, the
8 fee is to be paid as follows:

9 The initial partial filing fee listed on the attached Order
10 should be deducted by the prison trust account office from
11 the prisoner's trust account and forwarded to the Clerk of
12 the Court as the first installment payment on the filing fee.
13 This amount is twenty percent of the greater of (a) the
14 average monthly deposits to the prisoner's account for the
15 six-month period immediately preceding the filing of the
16 Complaint/Petition or (b) the average monthly balance in the
17 prisoner's account for the six-month period immediately
18 preceding the filing of the Complaint/Petition.

19 Thereafter, on a monthly basis, 20 percent of the preceding
20 month's income credited to the prisoner's trust account
21 should be deducted and forwarded to the Court each time the
22 amount in the account exceeds ten dollars (\$10.00). The
23 prison trust account office should continue to do this until
24 the filing fee has been paid in full.

25 If the prisoner does not have sufficient funds in his/her account
26 to pay the initial partial filing fee, the prison trust account
27 office should forward the available funds, and carry the balance
28 forward each month until the amount is fully paid.

If the prisoner has filed more than one Complaint, (s)he is
required to pay a filing fee for each case. The trust account
office should make the monthly calculations and payments for each
case in which it receives an order granting in forma pauperis and
these instructions.

The prisoner's name and case number must be noted on each
remittance. The initial partial filing fee is due within thirty
days of the date of the attached Order. Checks should be made
payable to Clerk, U.S. District Court and sent to Prisoner
Accounts Receivable, U.S. District Court, 450 Golden Gate Avenue,
Box 36060, San Francisco, CA 94102.
