3	3. There does not appear to be a live dispute regarding the review of documents	
4	for relevance or responsiveness. Both parties seem to agree that all responsive	
5	documents must be produced. The third issue therefore appears moot.	
6	Any party may object to this order to Judge Chen within 14 days. Fed. R. Civ. P.	
7	72(a).
