However, plaintiff Walker also failed to meet the new briefing schedule, and 19 the Court issued a second order to show cause why the case should not be dismissed for failure to 20 prosecute. Docket No. 26. In response, Walker explained the difficulties he has had representing 21 himself, including the fact that he did not receive copies of all the filed documents. He has asked for 22 a continuance of the case until after August 28, 2013, when he will be released from San Quentin State 23 Prison, so that he may "properly research his case, retain an attorney, and appear in court out of 24 custody." 25 26 27 28
