On that same date, the court notified plaintiff in writing that the action was deficient 16 because he did not file an actual complaint or pay the requisite \$350.00 filing fee 17 18 or, instead, submit a signed and completed court-approved in forma pauperis (IFP) 19 application. Plaintiff was advised that failure to file the requested items within 30 20 days would result in dismissal of the action. 21 More than 40 days have elapsed; however, plaintiff has not provided the 22 court with the requisite items or sought an extension of time to do so.
