14 Per order filed on June 13, 2013, petitioner's application for a writ of
15 habeas corpus under 28 U.S.C. § 2254 was construed as a protective petition and
16 stayed so that petitioner can exhaust his unexhausted claims in the state courts.
17 Docket #5 at 2. The court instructed the clerk to administratively close the case
18 and made clear that "[n]othing further will take place in this matter until
19 petitioner exhausts all of his claims all the way thru the Supreme Court of
20 California and, within 30 days thereafter, moves to reopen the case and lift the
21 court's stay." Id.

22 Petitioner has nonetheless filed a motion for appointment of counsel. The
23 motion (docket #8) is DENIED without prejudice to renewing after petitioner
24 exhausts all of his claims and moves to reopen the case and lift the court's stay.
25 SO ORDERED.
