On that same date, the court notified petitioner in writing that the action was deficient because he did not file an 16 actual petition or pay the requisite filing fee or, instead, submit a signed and 17 18 completed court-approved in forma pauperis (IFP) application. Petitioner was 19 advised that failure to file the requested items within 30 days would result in 20 dismissal of the action. 21 More than 40 days have elapsed; however, petitioner has not provided the 22 court with the requisite items or sought an extension of time to do so.
