10 2. Khan shall be dismissed with prejudice as a party plaintiff in the above-captioned

12 3. The Parties shall bear their own respective costs and attorneys’ fees related to and  
13 associated with the claims alleged by Khan, the litigation of those claims, and the dismissal of  
14 those claims.
