12 On August 22, 2013, Edgar Mora filed a complaint on behalf of  
13 his mother, Plaintiff Carmen Mora, seeking a court order  
14 compelling the University of California at San Francisco to admit  
15 Plaintiff to its hospital. Docket No. 1, Complaint, Ex. I. The  
16 complaint alleges that Plaintiff was recently discharged from the  
17 hospital's intensive care unit but remains in need of medical  
18 services. Id. After Plaintiff's son "informed the Court that  
19 this action presents a life or death situation," Magistrate Judge  
20 LaPorte construed Plaintiff's complaint as a request for a  
21 temporary restraining order and reassigned the matter to the  
22 undersigned judge. Docket No. 4, Order Reassigning Case.

23 After reviewing the complaint, the Court finds that Plaintiff  
24 has not identified a basis for federal subject matter  
25 jurisdiction. The cover sheet to her complaint identifies  
26 diversity of citizenship as the only basis of jurisdiction but  
27 also indicates that both parties in this action are citizens of  
28 the State of California. Accordingly, this action must be

1 dismissed. Plaintiff may attempt to seek the relief that she has  
2 requested here in state court.

3 IT IS SO ORDERED.
